

APPENDIX

The following ordinances and resolutions are no longer of general interest, primarily because they are of an historical or one-time nature only, the provisions of which were primarily completed directly after enactment. Because the enactments are mainly of an historical or administrative interest, it has not been considered necessary to include the entire text. Rather, the enactments are arranged in groups, according to subject matter, and, within each group, listed by title in chronological order. Annual budget and tax enactments have been listed only in the "Key to Disposition of Ordinances." Anyone desiring to read the full text of any of these enactments may do so by consulting the original records of the municipality.

Curbing shall be of stone 4 by 16 inches not less than 4 feet long with even jointed ends supported by yellow pine stakes 3 by 4 inches and not less than 18 inches in the ground well spiked to curb and placed every four feet along line of curb. Pavement shall be of brick, flagstone or standard cement composition or rolled cinders not less than 4 feet wide. A brick, flagstone or cement pavement must have substantial foundation at least 18 inches deep for cinder walks; the pavement to be excavated to a depth of 6 inches well watered and rolled. All expenses shall be paid by lot owners; all work done shall be subject to the approval of the Street and Light Committee. Along the Fox Chase and Huntington Turnpike the width of the sidewalk shall be seven feet; along all other streets the width of the sidewalk on each side of the street shall be 10 feet.</p>
